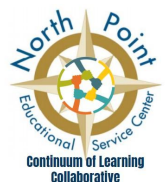
Mask/Facial Covering Policy

- The Governor of Ohio stated that masks were no longer required starting on June 2, 2021 and local school districts were given the authority to decide on whether or not to continue a mask policy. The Monroeville Local School Board rescinded the existing mask policy on June 21, 2021. Therefore, face masks are not required to be worn at this time.

- The Governor of Ohio stated that social/physical distancing was no longer required starting on June 2, 2021. Therefore, social/physical distancing is no longer required.

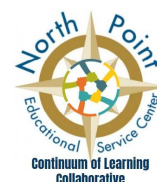
Handwashing and Respiratory Etiquette Policy

- Monroeville Local Schools will continue to follow CDC guidelines regarding the handwashing recommendations.
 - Students and Staff should wash their hands with soap and water:
 - After using the restroom
 - Before and after eating
 - If hands are visibly soiled
 - Upon encounter with chemicals or other items such as soil, in a science lab, art room, career/tech facility, or other activities that may soil hands
 - Upon encounter with chemicals during cleaning processes
 - After cleaning animal habitats, before and after handling animals,
 - Before and after food preparation activities in family science or other integrated class
 - After athletic practices and games
 - Upon encounter with bodily fluids
 - After recess
 - After sneezing or coughing
- The school district will also continue to provide hand sanitizing stations upon entry, in the cafeteria, and throughout the building in classrooms and hallways.
- Proper education in hand washing and respiratory etiquette will be provided by the school nurse.



Cleaning and Maintaining Healthy Facilities Policy

- The district shall develop and implement an environmental health and safety plan that is proactive and promotes district employee health and safety. They will also follow Federal and State Law regarding employee health and safety issues and continue to provide training in hazard recognition.
- The district will define employer and employee expectations related to health and safety.



Continuity of Service Plan

- Board policy and custodial expectations will continue by making sure that all staff are provided with supplies needed to disinfect and sanitize. They will also continue to follow sanitizing and disinfected routines provided by administration.



Contract Tracing Policy

- All COVID-19 cases and contact tracing will be handled by the Public Consulting Group (PCG). PCG is working on behalf of the Ohio Department of Health and many local health departments across Ohio to fulfil COVID-19 case interviews and quarantine of contacts. With this new transition, HCPH will no longer be completing the case interviews and will no longer send the emails to the school for isolation and quarantine of staff and students. PCG will be able to issue isolation and quarantine letters upon request which will include the dates of the isolation/quarantine.
- If a student is in a class with a positive COVID-19 student, quarantine is not necessary if the students have maintained social distancing of 3' or more and have had masks on. For athletics, the mandated length of quarantine for close contacts has been reduced from 14 to 10 days. If a student has been vaccinated for COVID-19 they are not required to quarantine.
- We continue to ask that parents keep students' home if they are running a temperature or showing symptoms associated with COVID-19. Students should not return to school or athletics until they are 100% symptom free.



Diagnostic and Screening Testing Policy

- Students will be sent on a case by case basis to the nurse's office to be screened for potential communicable illness. Based on the screening results the nurse will then follow up with parents to provide best practice outcomes.

Continuity of Service Plan

- A limited amount of Binax Rapid Covid Tests have been provided to our district by the local health department. These diagnostic tests will be used on a case by case basis as determined by our administration.



Effort to Provide Vaccinations to Staff and Students Policy

- All Monroeville Local Schools staff members have been offered on-site as well as off-site vaccination opportunities. The Huron County Public Health Department continues to offer vaccination opportunities to our staff, families, students, and the rest of our community. We will continue to provide information to our families on how to contact the local health department regarding vaccination opportunities on our district website.

Appropriate Accommodations for Children with Disabilities with Respect to Health and Safety Policy

- Each individual student will be assessed individually based on their needs and an appropriate plan of care will be created and implemented.
- Students with disabilities are encouraged to return to in-person learning to facilitate essential instruction in the school setting and accommodations as prescribed in the IEP will be followed.

Social, Emotional, and Mental Health Needs Plan for Staff and Students

- Social Emotional Screeners (DESSA) will be given to assess all students in grades K-12 starting our 2021-2022 academic school year.
- Character Strong social emotional curriculum will be implemented for all students in grades K-12 starting our 2021-2022 academic school year.
- Toolbox Project social emotional curriculum will be implemented as a tier 2 intervention as needed for students in grades K-6.
- Monroeville Local Schools partnered with Family Life Counseling and Psychiatric Services to provide our students and staff with counseling services. Our assigned counselor will continue to provide counseling services to our district during the 2021 summer and he will return for the 2021-2022 academic school year.
- Monroeville Local Schools has partnered with Lifestyle EAP through Cleveland Clinic Foundation to provide our staff with support services that include counseling, Eldercare support, Legal consultations, Financial wellness consultations, Identity Theft, Childcare services, Educational services, and Adoption.



Student Health and Food Services Plan

- Monroeville Local Schools has committed to providing free lunch and breakfast to our families throughout the summer. Our district also provides delivery of these meals to our families weekly. We will continue to offer free lunch and breakfast to all of our students for the 2021-2022 academic school year.
- Monroeville Local Schools partnered with Fisher-Titus Medical Center to provide our district

with a full time nurse. This nurse will continue to provide medical and nursing services to our district during the 2021 summer programs and she will return for the 2021-2022 academic school year.
